THAT aware that one of the functions which was devolved to the county governments under part II of the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya 2010 is that of Agriculture including but not limited to crop and animal husbandry; also aware that Bomet County is one of the leading tea producing counties in the country and therefore one of the highest foreign exchange earners; further aware that there are several privately and public owned tea companies and factories operating within the county; deeply concerned that some of the factories and companies such as Ndaraweta Tea Factory, Chebango Tea Factory and Nyayo Tea Zone, that are operating in the County have not benefited the local community in any way; Noting that all industries operating in the County should embrace corporate social responsibility practices such as provision of bursaries to bright and needy students and other developmental activities in order to enhance social and economic development in the County; further cognizant of the fact that Corporate social responsibility (CSR) is recognizing shared value and pursuing business goals in ways that align with the interests of a company's stakeholders and the communities they operate in; this County

Assembly urges the County Government to partner with the tea companies so as to ensure that at least 70% of employment opportunities benefits the local community.

STATEMENTS DUE TODAY

1. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Evaline Chepkemoi on 7th November, 2018 from the Chairperson Committee on Energy, Environment, and Water & Natural Resources on the Sergutiet Water Project in Chesoen Ward. The Hon. Member wished to be informed on the following;
 - a) The current status of Sergutiet Water Project and the funding of the project by the County Government.
 - b) The reason why the residents are charged KES 600 per month yet water is supplied only four days in a month.
 - c) The steps that the County Government has put in place to address the challenges faced by the area residents
2. Statement sought by Hon. Robert Serbai on 13th November, 2018 from the Chairperson Committee on Budget and Appropriation concerning the county expenditure during the Lake Region Economic Bloc (LREB) conference held between 21st -25th of October 2018. In the Statement, the Chairperson should indicate;
 - (a) the total expenditure;
 - (b) the expenditure that was used for:
 - (i) town beautification
 - (ii) preparation of the stadium
 - (c) (i) whether there are any contractors who were engaged to do any work or provide any service or supply any goods and if so; indicate the number of contractors, the work they were engaged to do and the total value of the work done or services provided;
(iii) If labor based, how many workers were engaged and how much was paid to each one of them and for how many days?
 - (d) Whether security personnel were engaged, how much was each paid?
 - (e) Whether outside catering service providers were engaged, how much was paid for the service;
 - (f) Have all the contractors engaged been paid? And if partially paid, how much is the pending Bill?
3. Comprehensive statement sought by Hon. Robert Rono on 25th July, 2018 from the Chairperson Committee on Labour and Public Service regarding talented youths in the county who have been engaged by the County Government to assist in disaster management. The Hon. Member wanted to be specifically informed on the following;
 - a) The number of the Youths who have been engaged as divers to assist in rescuing people during disasters.
 - b) The terms of engagement of the divers
