THAT, aware that one of the functions devolved under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution of Kenya 2010 is that of County Planning, also aware that Section 11 of the Urban Areas and Cities Act, 2011 provides that the governance and management of urban areas and cities shall be based inter alia on the principle of efficient and effective service delivery; also further aware that the National Information, Communications and Technology (ICT) Policy adopted by the Ministry of Information, Communications and Technology in November 2019 provides that Government ICT is vital for the delivery of efficient, cost-effective public services which are responsive to the needs of citizens and businesses.
