STATEMENTS DUE ON 13/10/2021

1. Comprehensive statement from the Chairperson Committee on Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries concerning the Tea deal between the County Government of Bomet and the Islamic Republic of Iran that saw the flagging of tea

consignment destined to Iran on the 25th of June, 2021. In the statement, the chairperson should:

a) Address the following: -

- a. From which Factory was the Consignment of tea sourced;
 - b. The quantity of the consignment in terms of tonnage;
 - c. The identity of the purchaser in the Islamic Republic of Iran;
 - d. The broad terms of the purchase agreement between the seller and the buyer of the tea; and
 - e. The agreed sale price per kilogram of processed tea.
- b) State whether there is any written agreements/memorandum of agreements or other document contextualizing the relations between the County Government of Bomet and the Islamic Republic of Iran
- c) State whether, in view of the fact that most small-holder tea farmers in county take their tea to KTDA managed factories, whether small-holder tea farmers stand will benefit from tea sale arrangement with Iran through KTDA.

2. Comprehensive statement from the Chairperson Committee on Energy, Environment, Water and Natural resources concerning water supply and water projects within the County. The seeker wanted to be specifically informed on the following;

- a) Water projects in the county;

- b) The list of all water projects which are currently in existence within the County
 - c) The list of all water projects which are currently managed by Bomet Water Company
 - d) Any support which has been advanced by the County Government to each water project
 - e) The number of customers/residents served by each water project
 - f) The status of all projects in terms of infrastructure including piping and pumping stations
- b) Bomet Water Company;
- a) The number of customers who are served by the company
 - b) How many employees have been engaged by the Company?
 - c) What is the total wage bill per month?
 - d) Total amount of revenues generated by the Company annually
 - e) What is the cost of electricity incurred by the Company annually?
 - f) How much is the outstanding expenses/Bills?
 - g) Maintenance cost incurred by the company annually

3. Comprehensive statement from the Chairperson Committee on Education, Youths and Sports concerning the County Revolving Fund which was meant to support college and university students within the County in the Financial Years 2020/2021 and 2021/2022. In the statement, the chairperson should:

- a) State the reason why Kshs 20 Million which was allocated to Revolving Fund under Vote Head 2630101 during 2020/2021 Financial Year was not utilized from 1st July, 2020 to 30th June, 2021.
- b) State whether the said ksh 20 million was transferred to Special Purpose Account.
- c) State the current status of the implementation of the County Revolving Fund which was meant to support college and university students in respect to the stated amount.
- d) Given that two allocations have not been spent (kshs 20 Million in the Financial 2020/2021 and another kshs 20 Million in the Financial 2021/2022), state how said allocations will be utilized.
- e) Whether the Revolving Fund programme will still serve the intended purpose given that there has been delays in its operationalization.

4. Hon. Leonard Kirui sought the following statement from the Chairperson Committee on Roads and Public Works on the following roads in Siongiroi Ward –

- a) Why the construction of the following roads have not commenced considering the fact that the contracts were awarded in January, 2021 for F/Y 2020/2021 which has since lapsed?
 - i) Atebwo Secondary – Mara Shiners road which measures 1.3 KM Contract No. CGB/ DR/ 043/2020-2021 awarded to York Holding LTD.
 - ii) Chemagel –Molinga - Kamungei road measuring 2 KM Contract No. CGB/ DR/045/2020-2021 awarded to Marutime Enterprises LTD.

- b) What occasioned delay in the implementation of the following roads considering the fact that they were under the projects for F/Y 2020/2021 which has since lapsed?
- i) Bingwa- Ngeny-Baraka ECDE - Kaptwolo Junction road, Tililbei- Lelkatet road, Bingwa Recovery-Don Bosco Junction road and Kimugul-Bethsaida AGC- Boundary Road. The said roads are measuring 4.5 KM Contract No. CGB/DR/KRB/024/2020-2021 awarded to Uswet Construction Co. LTD.
 - ii) Kabuson – Kimurgoi road and Yoywana Block 5 – Yoywana Forest Road measuring 2.7 KM Contract No. CGB/DR/044/2020-2021 awarded to Rivotex Africa LTD.
- c) Whether the funds allocated to the aforementioned roads will still be available in the current financial year? Whether the allocated funds for the aforementioned roads are within the Balance carried forward of 313,187,684 Million to the current F/Y?
- d) When do the contractors intend to embark on the construction of the said roads? Indicating the commencement and the completion dates
- e) Whether the pending implementation of the said roads will affect the construction of Roads meant for implementation of the current F/Y 2021/2022?

(Statement sought by Hon. Leonard Kirui on 10/08/2021 and was committed to the committee on Committee on Roads and Public Works)

The Committee was directed to summon the CECM and the contractors as the issues raised in the statement were cross cutting in all the wards. The committee was also directed to conduct site visits and report back to the Assembly within 21 days.
