8. NOTICE OF MOTION

Hon. Wesley Kiprotich gave the following notice of motion –

Aware that Article 201 (b) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 emphasizes the principles of Public Finance, stipulating that public money shall be used in a prudent and responsible manner.

Further recognizing the primary oversight role of the County Assembly in the County Government, as mandated by law.

Acknowledging the responsibility vested in the County Assembly to ensure that all investments and assets acquired are properly maintained and accounted for.

Recognizing that the County Government has recently acquired a substantial fleet of earth-moving equipment for road construction and maintenance across the county.

Concerned about the need for effective and efficient control, utilization, safeguarding, transparency, and accountability in the procurement, acquisition, fueling, and servicing of vehicles, plant machinery, and equipment.

Deeply troubled by the observed state of tens of county vehicles languishing in various garages across the county, some of which are being utilized for private purposes, and others lacking proper servicing schedules or fueling registers and detailed orders.

Further distressed by the absence of a comprehensive fleet management policy within the County Government to ensure the effective and efficient control, utilization, safeguarding and management of County Government vehicles, plant machinery (specifically Earth Moving machines) and equipment. It is crucial that drivers, machine operators, and transport managers understand their responsibilities in relation to county vehicles and machinery.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by this House that:

1. The County Executive is urgently urged to formulate a comprehensive fleet management policy within 30 days from the adoption of this motion.
2. This policy should encompass all aspects related to the accountability and maintenance of County Government vehicles, plants, and equipment.

3. The County Government should ensure that this formulated policy includes clear provisions for the effective control, utilization, safeguarding, and management of all County Government vehicles, plant machinery (including Earth Moving machines), and equipment.
 4. The policy should also lay out the responsibilities of drivers, machine operators, and transport managers concerning the proper use and maintenance of county vehicles and machinery.
 5. Once the fleet management policy is developed, it should be submitted to the County Assembly for approval within the stipulated 30-day period.
